ORDINANCE NO. 2020-54

**ENTITLED AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION
1193.06 (c) OF THE CODIFIED ORDINANCES OF THE
CITY OF GALION RELATING TO STREET ALIGNMENTS.**

WHEREAS, Section 1193.06 (c) of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Galion currently reads as follows:

(c) Alignment.

- (1) The street pattern shall make provision for the continuance of streets into adjoining areas and for the connection to existing rights-of-way in adjacent areas.
- (2) If a subdivision adjoins or contains an existing or proposed arterial or major collector street, direct access points to such street shall be minimized. The Planning Commission may require marginal access streets or reverse frontage with a planting strip of a minimum width of twenty (20) feet on the rear of those lots abutting the street, and no vehicular access across the strip.
- (3) If a subdivision adjoins an existing or proposed arterial or major collector street, the Planning Commission may require drainage improvements and the construction of separate turn lanes and/or traffic signals on such streets into the proposed subdivision.
- (4) Local streets shall be laid out so as to discourage use by through traffic.
- (5) Streets shall intersect one another at ninety (90) degrees, or as near to ninety (90) degrees as possible, but in no case less than seventy-five (75) degrees. The intersecting street must remain within these degree parameters for a distance of not less than one-hundred feet (100') from the intersection.
- (6) Street jogs shall be discouraged. Where such jogs are unavoidable, in no case shall the centerlines be offset by less than 125 feet.
- (7) The maximum length of a cul-de-sac shall be 600 feet, measured from the centerline of the intersecting street to the middle of the turn around.
- (8) Half width streets shall be prohibited.

WHEREAS, Section (c) 7 needs to be removed concerning the length of cul-de-sacs.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF
GALION, STATE OF OHIO:**

(c) Alignment.

- (1) The street pattern shall make provision for the continuance of streets into adjoining areas and for the connection to existing rights-of-way in adjacent areas.
- (2) If a subdivision adjoins or contains an existing or proposed arterial or major collector street, direct access points to such street shall be minimized. - (4) Local streets shall be laid out so as to discourage use by through traffic.
- (5) Streets shall intersect one another at ninety (90) degrees, or as near to ninety (90) degrees as possible, but in no case less than seventy-five (75) degrees. The intersecting street must remain within these degree parameters for a distance of not less than one-hundred feet (100') from the intersection.
- (6) Street jogs shall be discouraged. Where such jogs are unavoidable, in no case shall the centerlines be offset by less than 125 feet.
- (7) Half width streets shall be prohibited.

Section 3: That this Ordinance shall be published in accordance with applicable Ohio Law.

Section 4: That this Ordinance shall take effect at the earliest time allowed by law after its passage.

ORDINANCE NO. 2020-55

ENTITLED AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE SAFETY-SERVICE DIRECTOR TO ADVERTISE FOR BIDS AND TO ENTER INTO A CONTRACT WITH THE LOWEST AND BEST BIDDER THEREFOR, AS PROVIDED BY LAW, FOR VARIOUS STREET PAVING IMPROVEMENTS; AUTHORIZING PAYMENT THEREFOR, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GALION, STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1: That the Safety-Service Director of the City of Galion, Ohio be, and hereby is authorized to advertise for bids and to enter into a contract with the lowest and best bidder therefore, as provided by law, for the resurfacing of various streets throughout the City of Galion for the 2020 Paving Season.

Section 2: That the Auditor of the City of Galion, Ohio be and is hereby is, authorized to expend such sums as necessary to pay for said Project, not to exceed the total sum of Three Hundred Ninety Thousand Dollars (\$390,000) from the Street Construction Maintenance and Repair and Street Improvement Funds.

Section 3: That this Ordinance shall be published in accordance with Ohio Revised Code Sections 731.21 and 731.22.

Section 4: That in order to preserve the public peace, health, safety, and welfare of the City of Galion and its inhabitants, and in order to begin the bidding process to repair damaged streets within the paving season, this measure is determined to be an emergency Ordinance, and shall take effect and be in force immediately upon the earliest time allowed by law after its passage.

ORDINANCE NO. 2020-56

**ENTITLED AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 2019-85
(PERMANENT 2020 APPROPRIATIONS) BY APPROPRIATING FUNDS
FROM UNAPPROPRIATED FUNDS AND TRANSFERRING FUNDS IN
VARIOUS FUNDS AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.**

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF GALION, STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1: That Ordinance No. 2019-85 (Permanent 2020 Appropriations) passed December 23, 2019, be, and the same is hereby amended as delineated in the following sections:

Section 2: That One Thousand and 00/100 Dollars (\$1,000.00) be appropriated from unappropriated funds in 603-7090-52856 - Sewer Fund – General Government – Other Government – General Government Costs / Cost of Services - Westmoor Payments.

Section 3: That Four Thousand Nine Hundred Sixty-Seven and 00/100 Dollars (\$4,967.00) be appropriated from unappropriated funds in 204-3020-52501 – Recreation Fund – Leisure Time Activities – Misc. Recreation / Capital Outlay – Land and Improvement.

Section 4: That Four Thousand and 00/100 Dollars (\$4,000.00) be appropriated from unappropriated funds in 204-3020-52337 – Recreation Fund – Leisure Time Activities – Misc. Recreation / Contractual Services – Software Licensure/Subscriptions.

Section 5: That One Hundred Seventeen Thousand and 00/100 Dollars (\$117,000.00) be appropriated from unappropriated funds in 202-6030-52505- State Highway Improvement Fund – Transportation – State Highway / Capital Outlay – Infrastructure.

Section 6: That One Hundred Fifty Thousand and 00/100 Dollars (\$150,000.00) be appropriated from unappropriated funds in 201-6020-52505 – Street C M & R Fund – Transportation – Street Department / Capital Outlay – Infrastructure.

Section 7: That Thirty-Six Thousand Nine Hundred Seventy-Five and 00/100 Dollars (\$36,975.00) be appropriated from unappropriated funds in 230-2010-52456 – Health Department Fund –Public Health – General Health / Materials and Supplies – Medical Equipment.

Section 8: That Five Thousand Twenty-Five and 00/100 Dollars (\$5,025.00) be appropriated from unappropriated funds in 230-2010-52361 – Health Department Fund –Public Health – General Health / Contractual Services – Permits and Licenses.

Section 9: That One Hundred Ninety-Five Thousand and 00/100 Dollars (\$195,000) be appropriated from unappropriated funds in 101-9001-52919 – General Fund –Other Financing Uses – Transfers / Transfers – Transfers.

Section 10: That One Hundred Ninety-Five Thousand and 00/100 Dollars (\$195,000) be transferred from funds appropriated in 101-9001-52919 – General Fund –Other Financing Uses – Transfers / Transfers – Transfers to 401-0900-41910 – Permanent Improvement Fund-Other – Other Finances Sources / Other Financing Sources – Transfers.

Section 11: That One Hundred Ninety-Five Thousand and 00/100 Dollars (\$195,000) be appropriated from unappropriated funds in 401-7090-52501 – Permanent Improvement Fund – General Government – Other Government / Capital Outlay – Land and Improvement.

Section 12: That this Ordinance shall be published in accordance with applicable Ohio Law.

Section 13: That in order to preserve the public peace, health, safety and welfare of the City of Galion and its inhabitants, and in order to make the appropriation adjustments in the Permanent 2020 appropriations without delay to meet pending obligations, this measure is

determined to be an emergency Ordinance and shall take effect at the earliest time allowed by law after its passage.
