**ORDINANCE NO. 2023-1**

**ENTITLED AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE SAFETY-SERVICE DIRECTOR TO ADVERTISE FOR BIDS AND TO ENTER INTO CONTRACTS WITH THE LOWEST AND BEST BIDDERS THEREFORE, ACCORDING TO LAW, FOR THE PURCHASE OF CERTAIN MATERIALS AND EQUIPMENT REQUIRED AND NEEDED FOR THE OPERATION OF THE VARIOUS DEPARTMENTS OF THE CITY OF GALION, OHIO, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.**

**BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GALION, OHIO:**

SECTION 1: That the Safety-Service Director of the City of Galion, Ohio, be and is hereby authorized and directed to proceed according to law for the purchase of water meters, water treatment chemicals, pool chemicals, water pipes and fittings, copper wire, aluminum wire, copper tubing, electric meters, transformers, light poles, wood poles, lamps, curb stops, concrete pipe, drain tile, fencing, tile, slag, stone, sand, cement, ready mixed concrete, bituminous material for road work, cold and hot asphalt patching materials, street castings, manhole frames and covers, risers, catch basins, fuel, coal, salt, paint, signs (blanks), barricades, tires, luminaries, trash service, uniform and laundry service, paper supplies, janitorial supplies, office supplies, office machinery and other materials and supplies needed in the various departments annually, any materials and labor required for construction purposes, and any materials, equipment, and labor required for tree trimming purposes.

SECTION 2: That the Safety-Service Director be and is hereby authorized to advertise for bids for any of the foregoing and to enter into the necessary contract or contracts with the lower and best bidders therefore, in accordance with law, except as may be provided for by Section 735.05 of the Ohio Revised Code or other Ohio law. Said contracts shall be in accord with any applicable plans, specifications, or estimates on file in the office of the Safety-Service Director.

SECTION 3: That all ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith be and the same are hereby repealed.

SECTION 4: That this Ordinance be published in accordance with applicable Ohio law.

SECTION 5: That in order to preserve the public peace, health, and safety, and in order to acquire needed supplies in a timely manner, an emergency is found to exist and this Ordinance is declared to be an emergency measure and shall take effect immediately upon its passage.

**ORDINANCE NO. 2023-2**

**ENTITLED AN ORDINANCE CLARIFYING EMPLOYEE BENEFITS FOR CERTAIN NON-BARGAINING UNIT EMPLOYEES, REPEALING ORDINANCES NOS. 2008-54, 2008-25, 2011-17, 2013-46, 2014-28, 2016-117, AND 2019-91 TO THE EXTENT IT CONFLICTS WITH PROVISIONS OF THIS ORDINANCE, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.**

**WHEREAS**, the purpose of Ordinance No. 2005-45, passed May 24, 2005, was based upon the recommendation to clarify the City's policy for department heads and non-bargaining unit employee benefits, and

**WHEREAS**, the purpose of Ordinance No. 2007-11 passed February 2, 2007, was due to some changes which occurred since passage of Ordinance No. 2005-45 which created a need to modify some of the employee benefits described in Sections 1 through 6 of Ordinance No. 2005-45, and

**WHEREAS**, the purpose of Ordinance no. 2008-54 passed September 9, 2008, was due to some changes which occurred since passage of Ordinance No. 2007-11 which created a need to modify some of the employee benefits described in Sections 1 through 6 of Ordinance No. 2007-11, and

**WHEREAS**, the purpose of Ordinance No 2011-17 passed March 24, 2011 was due to some changes which occurred since passage of Ordinance No. 2008-54 which created a need to modify some of the employee benefits described in Sections 1 through 6 of Ordinance No. 2008-54.

**WHEREAS**, the purpose of Ordinance No. 2013-46 passed July 9, 2013 was due to further changes which have occurred since passage of Ordinance No. 2011-17, which created a need to modify and amend some of the employee benefits described in Ordinance No. 2011-17, and

**WHEREAS**, the purpose of Ordinance No. 2014-28 passed March 25, 2014 was due to further changes which have occurred since passage of Ordinance No. 2013-46 which created a need to modify Ordinance No. 2013-46; and

**WHEREAS**, the purpose of Ordinance No. 2016-117 passed December 27, 2016 was due to further changes which have occurred since passage of Ordinance No. 2014-28 which created a need to modify Ordinance No. 2014-28; and



**WHEREAS**, the purpose of Ordinance No. 2019-91 passed December 23, 2019 was due to changes which have occurred since the passage of Ordinance No. 2016-117 which created a need to modify Ordinance No. 2016-117; and

**WHEREAS**, the pay range assignment and positions for non-bargaining positions as contained in Section 7 of the Compensation Analysis prepared by Clemens, Nelson & Associates, Inc., dated January 1990 and set forth on Page 28 thereof, was amended September 6, 1994 by Ordinance No. 94-6094, May 14, 1996 by Ordinance 96-6197, November 27, 2001 by Ordinance 2001-84, April 8, 2008 by Ordinance No. 2008-25, March 24, 2011 by Ordinance No. 2011-17, July 9, 2013 by Ordinance No. 2013-46, by Ordinance No. 2014-28 on March 25, 2014, by Ordinance No. 2016-117 passed December 27, 2016 and as amended most recently in separate Ordinance No. 2020-8 passed April 14, 2020, and

**WHEREAS**, Sections 1 through 3 and Section 5 of Ordinance No 2019-91, as approved on December 23, 2019, currently reads as follows:

SECTION 1: That effective January 1, 2020, the employee benefits for the non-bargaining unit, full-time employees and are performing work in any department except police officers and firefighters shall be consistent with the corresponding benefits contained in the Local 2243, Council 8, AFSCME Collective Bargaining Agreement in effect for the term of January 1, 2020 through December 31, 2022 with the exception of the following:

Vacation Leave – Article 30, except non-bargaining unit employees may use vacation in their first year of employment as it accrues instead of waiting until completion of their first year of service.

Holidays – Article 31, except non-bargaining unit employees who are exempt from overtime under the Fair Labor Standards Act do not have to complete 120 calendar days of employment to receive the paid holidays.

Annual Clothing Allowance – No clothing allowance or uniform allowance will be paid to non-bargaining unit employees who do not wear uniforms.

SECTION 2: That effective January 1, 2020, the employee's benefits for the non-bargaining unit, full-time police officers shall be consistent with the corresponding benefits contained in the Ohio Patrolmen's Benevolent Association and Fraternal Order of Police, Ohio Labor Council, Inc. Collective Bargaining Agreements in effect for the term of January 1, 2020 through December 31, 2022 with the exception of the following:

Holidays- Article 21, except non-bargaining unit employees who are exempt from overtime under the Fair Labor Standards Act do not have to complete 90 calendar days of employment to receive the paid holidays.

**SECTION 3:** That effective January 1, 2020, the employee's benefits for the non-bargaining unit, full-time firefighters shall be consistent with the corresponding benefits contained in the Local 435 International Association of Firefighters Collective Bargaining Agreement in effect for the term of January 1, 2020 through December 31, 2022 with the exception of the following:

Holidays- Article 25, except non-bargaining unit employees who are exempt from overtime under the Fair Labor Standards Act do not have to complete 90 calendar days of employment to receive the paid holidays.

**SECTION 5:** That Ordinance No 2008-54, passed September 9, 2008, Ordinance No. 2008-25, passed April 8, 2008, Ordinance No. 2011-17 passed March 24, 2011 and Ordinance No. 2013-46 passed July 9, 2013 be, and the same are hereby, repealed, but only to the extent the provisions contained herein conflict with and thereby supersede analogous provisions in said Ordinance No. 2008-54, Ordinance No. 2008-25, Ordinance No. 2011-17, Ordinance No. 2013-46, Ordinance No. 2014-28, and Ordinance No. 2016-117.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GALION, STATE OF OHIO:**

**SECTION 1:** That Sections 1 through 3 and Section 5 of Ordinance No 2019-91, as amended on December 23, 2019, will now be amended and read as follows:

**SECTION 1:** That effective January 1, 2023, the employee benefits for the non-bargaining unit, full-time employees and are performing work in any department except police officers and firefighters shall be consistent with the corresponding benefits contained in the Local 2243, Council 8, AFSCME Collective Bargaining Agreement in effect for the term of January 1, 2023 through December 31, 2025 with the exception of the following:

Vacation Leave – Article 30, except non-bargaining unit employees may use vacation in their first year of employment as it accrues instead of waiting until completion of their first year of service.

Holidays – Article 31, except non-bargaining unit employees who are exempt from overtime under the Fair Labor Standards Act do not have to complete 120 calendar days of employment to receive the paid holidays.

Annual Clothing Allowance – No clothing allowance or uniform allowance will be paid to non-bargaining unit employees who do not wear uniforms.

**SECTION 2:** That effective January 1, 2023, the employee's benefits for the non-bargaining unit, full-time police officers shall be consistent with the corresponding benefits contained in the Ohio Patrolmen's Benevolent Association and Fraternal Order of Police, Ohio Labor Council, Inc. Collective Bargaining Agreements in effect for the term of January 1, 2023 through December 31, 2025 with the exception of the following:

Holidays- Article 21, except non-bargaining unit employees who are exempt from overtime under the Fair Labor Standards Act do not have to complete 90 calendar days of employment to receive the paid holidays.

**SECTION 3:** That effective January 1, 2023, the employee's benefits for the non-bargaining unit, full-time firefighters shall be consistent with the corresponding benefits contained in the Local 435 International Association of Firefighters Collective Bargaining Agreement in effect for the term of January 1, 2023 through December 31, 2025 with the exception of the following:

Holidays- Article 25, except non-bargaining unit employees who are exempt from overtime under the Fair Labor Standards Act do not have to complete 90 calendar days of employment to receive the paid holidays.

**SECTION 5:** That Ordinance No 2008-54, passed September 9, 2008, Ordinance No. 2008-25, passed April 8, 2008, Ordinance No. 2011-17 passed March 24, 2011 and Ordinance No. 2013-46 passed July 9, 2013 be, and the same are hereby, repealed, but only to the extent the provisions contained herein conflict with and thereby supersede analogous provisions in said Ordinance No. 2008-54, Ordinance No. 2008-25, Ordinance No. 2011-17, Ordinance No. 2013-46, Ordinance No. 2014-28, Ordinance No. 2016-117, and 2019-91.

**SECTION 2:** That the aforementioned Sections replace Sections 1-3 and 5 of Ordinance No. 2019-91 in their entirety.

**SECTION 3:** That this Ordinance shall be published in accordance with Ohio Revised Code 731.21 and 731.22.

**SECTION 4:** That in order to preserve the public peace, health, safety and welfare of the City of Galion and its inhabitants, and in order to modify the employee benefits for certain non-bargaining unit employees of the City effective January 2023, this measure is determined to be an emergency Ordinance, and provided it receives the affirmative

vote of at least five members elected to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its adoption, otherwise from and after the earliest time allowed by law, after its passage.

**ORDINANCE NO. 2023-3**

**ENTITLED AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 2022-98 (PERMANENT 2023 APPROPRIATIONS) BY TRANSFERRING AND ADVANCING FUNDS IN VARIOUS FUNDS AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.**

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF GALION, STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1: That Ordinance No. 2022-98 (Permanent 2023 Appropriations) passed December 28, 2022 be, and the same is hereby amended as delineated in the following sections:

Section 2: That Four Hundred Twenty-Three Thousand, Seven Hundred Seventeen and 88/100 Dollars (\$423,717.88) be transferred from 101-9001-52915 General Fund – Other Financing Uses – Department: 9002 – Transfers – Transfers to Health Subsidy to 230-0900-41910 Health Department – Other Financing Sources – Other Financing Sources – Other Financing Sources – Transfers.

Section 3: That Two Hundred Sixty-Two Thousand, Three Hundred Eighty-Two and 52/100 Dollars (\$262,382.52) be advanced from 101-9002-52920 General Fund – Other Financing Uses – Department: 9002 – Transfers – Advances Out to 215-0900-41920 SAFER GRANT FIRE – Other Financing Sources – Other Financing Sources – Other Financing Sources – Advances In (to be repaid no later than July 1, 2024).

Section 4: That Forty Thousand, and 00/100 Dollars (\$40,000.00) be transferred from 101-9001-52920 General Fund – Other Financing Uses – Transfers – Transfers – Transfers to Grant Funds to 215-0900-41910 SAFER Grant Fire – Other Financing Sources – Other Financing Sources – Other Financing Sources – Transfers.

Section 5: That this Ordinance shall be published in accordance with applicable Ohio Law.

Section 6: That in order to preserve the public peace, health, safety and welfare of the City of Galion and its inhabitants, and in order to make the adjustments in the Permanent 2023 appropriations without delay to meet pending obligations, this measure is determined to be an emergency Ordinance and shall take effect at the earliest time allowed by law after its passage.
