**ORDINANCE NO. 2022-18**

**ENTITLED AN ORDINANCE SETTING THE POWER COST  
ADJUSTMENT AS REQUIRED PER ORDINANCE NO. 2015-39,  
AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.**

WHEREAS, Galion City Council passed Ordinance 2015-39, which amended Section 18 of Ordinance 2005-37 relating to the setting of the Power Cost Adjustment (PCA), and

WHEREAS, pursuant to that revision, in February and August, the Utilities Committee of City Council is required to consider the Initial Power Cost Adjustment Factor (IPCAF) calculation received from the offices of the Auditor and Utility Office Manager, and consider information received from the same offices as well as their recommendations, and

WHEREAS, the power cost adjustment may also be considered for change at any time a change is deemed necessary

WHEREAS, the IPCAF calculation is currently set at \$0.0000, and

WHEREAS, recommendations received from these offices is that the PCA be set at the amount of \$0.0034, and the other information considered confirms that recommendation, and

WHEREAS, that number is more than a ten percent (10%) deviation from the currently charged PCA, necessitating Council ratification of the Utilities Committee approved PCA.

**NOW, THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GALION, STATE OF OHIO:**

Section 1. That the Power Cost Adjustment (PCA) be set at \$0.0034 until changed by Council pursuant to Ordinance 2015-39, and

Section 2. That this PCA be applied to bills generated on or after April 1, 2022.

Section 3: That this Ordinance shall be published in accordance with Ohio Revised Code Sections 731.21 and 731.22.

Section 4: That in order to preserve the public peace, health, safety, and welfare of the City of Galion and its inhabitants, and in order bills to be processed in a timely manner this measure is determined to be an emergency Ordinance, and shall take effect and be in force immediately upon the earliest time allowed by law after its passage.

**ORDINANCE NO. 2022-17**

**ENTITLED AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE SAFETY SERVICE DIRECTOR TO EXECUTE ANY AND ALL DOCUMENTS TO TRANSFER PROPERTY TO THE GALION PORT AUTHORITY AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.**

WHEREAS, the Galion Port Authority has developed a plan for the use of a 4.80 acre property within the corporate limits of the City of Galion and specifically known as Outlots 229, 230, 460, 461, 462, and 463 of the consecutively numbered lots of said city and bearing PPN's 19-00-22908.000 and 19-00-22909.000 (hereafter "Parcels"), and

WHEREAS, said parcels are currently owned by the City of Galion, and

WHEREAS, the Galion Port Authority was created under Section 4582 of the Ohio Revised Code, and

WHEREAS, Section 4582.121 of the Ohio Revised Code provides that legislative authorities of Ohio municipalities can directly convey to port authorities so established real property not need for municipal purposes without competitive bidding and on mutually agreeable terms, and

WHEREAS, City Council desires to undertake such a transfer of the Parcels; and

WHEREAS, a transfer agreement has been developed to effectuate this transfer.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GALION, STATE OF OHIO:**

Section 1: That based upon information provided, that City Council wishes to transfer Outlots 229, 230, 460, 461, 462, and 463 to the Galion Port Authority.

Section 2: That City Council finds that said property is not needed for municipal purposes.

Section 3: That City Council authorizes the Safety Service Director to enter into the transfer agreement, in the substantive form as attached and incorporated herein, which is mutually acceptable to both the City of Galion and the Galion Port Authority and also authorizes the Safety-Service Director to execute any documents necessary to effect such transfer.

Section 4: That this Ordinance shall be published in accordance with Ohio Revised Code Sections 731.21 and 731.22.

Section 5: That to enhance the economic development of the City of Galion, an emergency is found to exist and this Ordinance shall take place immediately from the date of its adoption.

## AGREEMENT REGARDING CONVEYANCE OF REAL ESTATE

This Agreement regarding transfer of real estate (hereafter "Agreement"), dated \_\_\_\_\_, 2022, is entered into by and between THE CITY OF GALION, OHIO, an Ohio municipal corporation (hereafter "City"), and the GALION PORT AUTHORITY, a port authority created under Section 4582.121 of the Ohio Revised Code (hereafter "Port Authority"), collectively hereafter known as the "Parties."

### RECITALS

- A. The City owns 4.80 acres of land located within the corporate limits of the City of Galion and known more specifically as Outlots 229, 230, 460, 461, 462 and 463 of the consecutively numbered lots of said city and bearing PPNs 19-00-22908.000 and 19-00-22909-000 (hereafter "Parcel").
- B. Section 4582.121 of the Ohio Revised Code provides that legislative authorities of Ohio municipalities can directly convey real property to port authorities so created if said property is not needed for municipal purposes without competitive bidding and on mutually agreeable terms.
- C. The Port Authority has created a development plan for the Parcels consistent both with its mission and the economic betterment of the City of Galion.

### AGREEMENT

In exchange for and in consideration of the promises and covenants exchanged herein, the Parties agree as follows:

1. **Transfer of Parcels.** Subject to and on the terms stated in this Agreement, City shall transfer the Parcels to the Port Authority, and the Port Authority shall receive the Parcels from the City.

2. **Purchase Price.** The purchase price of the Parcels shall be Zero Dollars (\$0.00).



3. **Closing Date.** The Parties shall cause the Closing to occur at the Galion Municipal Building no later than April 1 or until the earliest time thereafter when said Closing may feasibly be conducted.

4. **Title.** The City shall convey fee simple title to the Port Authority by Quit Claim Deed, free and clear of all liens except those of record, those stated in the deed, and subject only to any covenants in this Agreement which are so stated as to survive the Closing.

5. **Taxes.** The Parties shall prorate taxes and assessments on the Parcels for the current tax year between one another as of the date of Closing.

5. **Condition.** The City makes no representations to the Port Authority in terms of the condition of the Parcels or its suitability for any particular use.

6. **Development of Parcels.** Any subsequent development of the Parcels must comply in all respects with the City of Galion Subdivision Regulations as currently set forth in Part Eleven, Title Nine of the City of Galion Codified Ordinances, or as subsequently amended. This section shall survive the Closing.

7. **Representation on Compliance with Ohio Law.** The Port Authority hereby represents and warrants that it has conducted its meetings, adopted relevant resolutions, made relevant decisions, and in all matters to date related to this transaction and the development of the Parcel acted in compliance with the Ohio Ethics Law as set forth in Sections 102 and 2921 of the Ohio Revised Code, as well as the Ohio Sunshine Law and Ohio Open Meetings Act, as set forth in Section 121 of the Ohio Revised Code. If at any time it is determined that this representation is not correct, the City may demand that the Parcels be immediately transferred back to the City of Galion and the City shall be entitled to compensation from the Port Authority for damages related to the breach of said representation and warranty. This section shall survive the Closing.

8. **Entire Agreement.** This Agreement represents the entire meeting of the minds between the Parties, and supersedes any prior negotiations, understandings, or agreements, if any, related to the Parcels. This Agreement may be amended, modified, or supplemented only by an instrument in writing duly executed by the Parties.

**ORDINANCE NO. 2022-29**

**ENTITLED AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE SAFETY-SERVICE DIRECTOR TO CONTRACT FOR INTERNET AUCTION SERVICES TO DISPOSE OF UNNEEDED PERSONAL PROPERTY OWNED BY THE CITY OF GALION, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.**

WHEREAS, Section 721.15 of the Ohio Revised Code authorizes the legislative authority of a municipal corporation to authorize the sale of unneeded City-owned personal property, regardless of the property's value, by internet auction; and

WHEREAS, the Council of the City of Galion and the Safety-Service Director have determined that internet auction is a viable way to dispose of some unneeded City-owned personal property.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GALION, STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1: That the Council of the City of Galion does hereby authorize the sale of unneeded personal property owned by the City by internet auction and does hereby authorize the Safety-Service Director to enter into a Memorandum of Understanding with GovDeals, Inc. for internet auction services in accordance with the specifications therefor now on file in the Office of the Safety-Service Director.

**ORDINANCE NO. 2022-30**

**ENTITLED AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE SAFETY-SERVICE DIRECTOR TO ENTER INTO AN AGREEMENT WITH GPD GROUP FOR PROFESSIONAL ENGINEERING SERVICES RELATED TO WATER TREATMENT PLANT IMPROVEMENTS, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.**

WHEREAS, the City of Galion is the owner and operator of a municipal water system, and

WHEREAS, the City of Galion is in need of engineering services to assist in improvements to the water treatment plant, and

WHEREAS, the City wants to utilize the services of GPD Group for professional engineering services for Water Treatment Plant improvements.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GALION, STATE OF OHIO:**

Section 1: That the Safety-Service Director be, and he is hereby, authorized to enter into an agreement with GPD Group for professional engineering services Water Treatment Plant Improvements, substantially in accordance with the attached hereto and made a part hereof, as Exhibit A, at a cost not to exceed One Hundred Eighteen Thousand Six Hundred Seventy and 90/100 (\$118,670.90), paid from the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 Fund (268-7090-52317).

Section 2: That this Ordinance shall be published in accordance with Ohio Revised Code Sections 731.21 and 731.22.

Section 3: That in order to preserve the public peace, health, and safety of the City of Galion, and to continue with experienced engineering services so that the Project can proceed without delay, an emergency is found to exist, and this Ordinance shall take effect and be in force upon the earliest time allowed by law after its passage.

## City of Galion – Water Treatment Plant Improvements

Dear Mayor O'Leary,

GPD Group is pleased to submit this scope and fee proposal for design services for the subject project. The following proposal is our understanding of the services to be provided and an estimated design fee.

It is our understanding the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency (OEPA) recently performed a Sanitary Survey of the City's Water Treatment Plant (WTP) and provided a list of deficiencies that are required to be addressed. It is also understood the City will be using ARPA funds for the project that have already been secured.

### Scope of Services

GPD Group met with City officials on January 31<sup>st</sup>, 2022 and performed a site visit of the WTP on February 2<sup>nd</sup>, 2022. From those two discussions, it was determined that the project improvements will include design for the replacement of the Ferric Bulk Tank, replacement of the Lime Storage Tank, replacement of the Caustic Soda Tank, evaluation of West Clarifier with design of either rehabilitation or replacement of the equipment and replacement of two (2) inoperable process control valves.

### Condition Assessment

The GPD Team will perform one site visit to determine the final construction scope of the proposed improvements. The City will empty the contents of all the tanks (where possible) for GPD personnel to review the current conditions of the assets included in the scope. This site visit will also be used to identify the valve replacement locations and required coordination with operations. For the purpose of this scope, it is assumed the Ferric, Lime and Caustic tanks will be replaced. Should this assessment and subsequent cost comparison result in rehabilitation of any of these tanks being the best option, the design would be revised to incorporate rehabilitation requirements.

### Ferric Tank Replacement

The design will include the demolition and replacement of the existing ferric tank. It is assumed the piping, foundation, spill containment and other appurtenances are in good condition and will not require improvements. Applicable tank material options will be reviewed, and manufacturers contacted to gain a thorough understanding of cost, expected life, Operations & Maintenance (O&M) and expected delivery duration. The recommended option will be incorporated into the Construction Documents.

### Caustic Soda Tank Replacement

The design will include the demolition and replacement of the existing caustic soda tank. It is assumed the foundation, spill containment and other appurtenances are in good condition and will not require improvements. The piping throughout this area is in poor condition with multiple failures and repairs. It is assumed the piping replacement will include the piping between the tank and the chemical feed pumps. No piping replacement design is anticipated outside of the spill containment area. The existing man door openings will be reviewed and modifications included in the design to allow for the installation of the new caustic tank. Applicable tank material options will be reviewed, and manufacturers contacted

to gain a thorough understanding of cost, expected life, O&M and expected delivery duration. The recommended option will be incorporated into the Construction Documents.

### **Lime Storage Tank Replacement**

The design will include the demolition and replacement of the existing lime storage tank. It is assumed the piping, foundation, roof loading, spill containment and other appurtenances are in good condition and will not require improvements. Applicable tank material options will be reviewed, and manufacturers contacted to gain a thorough understanding of cost, expected life, O&M and expected delivery duration. The recommended option will be incorporated into the Contract Documents.

### **West Clarifier Improvements**

GPD will coordinate with the WTP to gain access to the clarifier for the purpose of reviewing the current condition of the equipment. If possible, a manufacturer's representative would accompany the design team for this site visit to provide additional insight into the current condition of the equipment and improvements recommendations. Rehabilitation requirements will be identified, along with ancillary considerations such as construction duration (outage time for the WTP) and expected useful life of repairs. Similarly, replacement requirements will be identified. The two options will be reviewed with the recommended option being incorporated into the Construction Documents.

### **Process Valve Replacement**

During the February 2<sup>nd</sup> site visit it was noted that two major process control valves are inoperable. Replacement of these failed valves would provide the WTP with needed operational flexibility and control. The specific locations will be determined during the condition assessment visit and depicted on the Construction Documents. The design team will also work with the WTP to determine and specify a detailed sequence of construction for the replacement of these valves to minimize the impacts to plant operations.

### **Deliverables**

The following is a list of the anticipated design deliverables for the project:

- Preliminary Design Memorandum: This document will summarize the findings from the condition assessment site visit, tank material option investigations, valve replacement locations and construction sequencing, clarifier equipment investigations and recommendations for improvements, final design scope and potential pre-purchase of equipment. This design stage will also include planning level design drawings of the proposed improvements and preliminary list of technical specifications.
- 60% Design Drawings and Specifications
- 90% Design Drawings and Specifications
- Bid Documents

### **Assumptions and Exclusions**

The following is a list of design assumptions:

- The City will provide WTP record plans, flow data and O&M information for the equipment included in the scope of services.
- The equipment and tankage noted in the scope will be empty and clean (where possible) for the condition assessment efforts.
- A maximum of three (3) tank material options will be reviewed.
- Two (2) clarifier equipment manufacturers will be reviewed, if applicable.
- Minor coordination with the OEPA in order to respond to the Sanitary Survey Letter in the form of one (1) meeting and a formal response letter.

- Tank capacities and connection points will match existing.
- The improvements will utilize existing electrical service, controls, structural supports and inlet/outlet piping connections.
- This scope and phase of work stops at project bidding. Services during construction will be included in a future contract or modification.
- The proposed caustic tank can be installed through the existing man doors opening.
- Bidding services scope includes creating the bid advertisement and electronic bid documents, issuing one (1) addendum to answer bidding questions, attend the Bid opening and assist the City in review of the bid proposals.
- In providing estimates of probable construction cost, the Client understands that the Consultant has no control over the cost or availability of labor, equipment or materials, or over market conditions or the Contractor's method of pricing, and that the Consultant's estimates of probable construction cost are made on the basis of the Consultant's professional judgment and experience. The Consultant makes no warranty, express or implied, that the bids or the negotiated cost of the Work will not vary from the Consultant's estimate of probable construction cost. Please note that the pricing, contingencies and opinion contained or referenced herein anticipates a standard economic environment and does not account for any uncertainty related to COVID-19 or the current extreme market conditions. As such, Client and Consultant recognize the current market volatility due to such factors including but not limited to COVID-19 restrictions, material and equipment shortages, and rapid price fluctuations. The existence and contents of this document shall not be construed to create responsibility or liability of Client or Consultant for changes related to this estimate of probable cost.

The following is a list of design exclusions:

- PTI permitting and fees.
- Building permits and fees.
- Hard copy bid document preparation and creation.
- Bidding documents sale and management.
- Structural, mechanical, electrical or controls (SCADA) design services.
